CHOOSING GOD'S WAY

The Patriarch, Moses, recorded in holy writ as the meekest man, (Num 12:3) requests of the Lord a favour. He sojourned forty days and nights in Mount Sinai as he visited with the Lord in counsel upon matters concerning the redemption, structure and governance of the children of Israel. "And he said, I beseech thee, show me thy glory", **Ex. 33:18**.

The Lord answered "And He said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee..." **Ex. 33:19**. God responds to Moses' request to see His glory alluding to the concept of His name being associated with His glory. "And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth generation." **Ex. 34:5-7**. In verse 7 the attributes of the Lord's character are listed out. These are the same traits **we ourselves will bear** as we pattern our lives after Christ who is the way the truth and the life. He gives us freedom to choose His way and He has given us time to decide. Israel was given time before the mantle of the gospel was taken from them and given to the Gentiles. "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:" **Phil 2:5**.

The Desire of Ages contrasts the character of Christ against the character of Satan. "It is no part of Christ's mission to compel men to receive Him. It is Satan, and men actuated by his spirit, that seek to compel the conscience. Under a pretense of zeal for righteousness, men who are confederate with evil angels bring suffering upon their fellow men, in order to convert them to their ideas of religion; but Christ is ever showing mercy, ever seeking to win by the revealing of His love. He can admit no rival in the soul, nor accept of partial service; but He desires only voluntary service, the willing surrender of the heart under the constraint of love. There can be no more conclusive evidence that we possess the spirit of Satan than the disposition to hurt and destroy those who do not appreciate our work, or who act contrary to our ideas." DA 487.3.

Our God, the only true and living God, will never force us, nor are we to force our brothers and sisters. **Our salvation is not on autopilot**. We must choose Christ daily. Living for our own desires or conforming to the society and systems around us will only ensnare us in the trap of Satan. May we surrender our lives to the will of God in whom there is true safety and freedom in Christ our Lord.

DANGERS OF SPIRITUALISM



In the first of this 2-part series, an overview of spiritualism was presented as being one arm of the threefold union that will trample religious liberty in the end times. In its early stages spiritualism denied the Bible and derided Christianity but since the 20th century it has begun to profess both and has many guises; according to Sis White, far from becoming more tolerable as a result of this new stance, it has become more dangerous. This article looks more closely at this phenomenon which has pervasive influence both within and outside the Church.

Spiritism is sometimes mistakenly equated with spiritualism, because they share similar underlying beliefs. Spiritism reflects only a segment of the teaching of spiritualism, however, in that it is based on belief in a spirit world which includes the spirits of the dead, and mankind seeking engagement with the spirit world as a **source of knowledge and**

power. The Bible confirms that the spirit world exists consisting of both angels and demons, but it expressly **forbids us** from making contact with this world (Deu. 18:10-11) Thus the basic underlying tenet of being taught or empowered by the spirits is contrary to Biblical precept.

Spiritual Formation

The extra-Biblical approach has been institutionalized by a very popular powerful tool now widely used in religious educational circles, namely 'Spiritual Formation'. Because it is broadly equated with spiritual growth, the idea behind it has been integral to practically all religions, but it is also a specific movement within 20th century Protestantism. Its methods originated as a feature of Jesuit training in the 16th century, which were then adopted generally by the Roman Catholic Church to train priests in the 1960s. The Association of Theological Schools in the U.S. soon followed suit and it became widely accepted in Protestantism, **including SDA institutions**. It has been said to be 'essentially **sanctification with a different name**'. The methodology stresses rigorous daily exercises under the guidance of a spiritual leader/mentor to bring about total commitment to its teaching.

Revision of Christianity

A renowned leader of contemporary religion proclaims (in 2016) that Christianity must "lose its monotheistic

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notions to embrace a grander, more inclusive God who demonstrates solidarity with all" and is a "spirit of love flowing within everything" (Brian McLaren - The Great Spiritual Migration: How the World's Largest Religion is Seeking a Better Way to be Christian). In general, a complete revision of Christianity is being promoted starting with God Himself.

Spiritualism's seductive teachings have made it one of Satan's most successful ploys to woo believers away from the plain teachings of the Bible and to **embrace and exalt deceptions** such as:

Eastern philosophies and practices (e.g. meditation and yoga) which promise alluring spiritual experiences such as 'oneness with God and nature' rather than eternal salvation;


Forms of worship so focused on **emotions and the senses** that the central importance of the word of God is lost.

Sis White highlighted a factor lying at the root of the rejection of Bible teachings in favor of manmade philosophies - man's pride in his own opinion and capabilities, leading to skepticism, higher criticism of and loss of faith in the Bible, as well as reliance on a 'power' within himself for pursuing perfection. Thus spiritualism "becomes a continual personal religion to nurture and enlighten the spirit within us" with "multitudes ... taught to believe that desire is the highest law, that license is liberty, and that man is accountable only to himself." Undoubtedly the widely advocated unbiblical practices have produced real spiritual experiences, but these are **not from God**.

Protection

How can we protect ourselves from these allurements? We have to first acknowledge that God has put boundaries around how we can come to Him and we ignore them at our peril. His word, rightly understood and applied, keeps us within His guidelines and enables us to discern the deceptions for what they are. His truths, our 'shield and buckler', are seen in **Christ our High Priest** through whom alone we can come to God.

To have a true epignosis of God is what is called saving knowledge.
